Primary School PE & Sports Funding 2017-18

The legacy of the London Olympics 2012 saw the introduction of the Primary School PE and Sports Funding which is focused on improving provision of PE within primary schools. In addition, this funding is used to increase the fitness and physical activity levels of children within schools. With the announcement of the Sugar Tax levy, schools now receive additional funding to help allow children to receive 30 minutes of physical activity per day.

Historically, Barmby Moor has always made a strong commitment to PE, which is evident in the continued membership of the South Hunsley School Partnership and Youth Sports Trust and also through the wide range of out of school activities and involvement in competitive sport. We are committed to providing pupils with activities that they choose and endeavour to encourage high levels of participation through a mixture of competitive and non-competitive activities.

At Barmby Moor we have a strong belief that all children should be given the opportunity to participate in a wide variety of sports, competitions and activities. We run a wide range of lunch time and after-school clubs and we employ specialise coaches to coach in curriculum time, all of whom have links to local sports clubs.

Barmby Moor has received two instalments totalling £13,341.

Funding

Barmby Moor CE Primary School is a member of the South Hunsley Sports Partnership which allows pupils to compete at local, regional and national level. We are also members of the Youth Sports Trust.

Teaching and Learning

We use specialist Sports Coaches who work alongside staff to deliver PE sessions and extra-curricular activities. This allows staff members to increase their knowledge and confidence in teaching a range of different activities.

At Barmby Moor this will involve:

- Providing support for planning, formative and summative assessment
- Working alongside staff in delivery of lessons
- Whole school staff development
- Participation in a wide range of sports competitions
- Opportunity to take part in sports not usually available in a primary school

Professional Development

- SSCO staff development
- SPORTing Chance staff development

Resources

- We were lacking resources for high quality invasion game PE lessons. Therefore, new netball equipment as well as new goal posts and nets have enabled the PE coordinator to deliver higher quality lessons in which all pupils can take part and engage more successfully.
- The PE coordinator is also a qualified GO:Fence instructor. Some of the funding was used to purchase fencing equipment which has allowed the PE coordinator to organise and run after school clubs and enrichment lessons in school. This has led to the engagement of pupils who were more difficult to involve in physical activity.

Out of school activities

- We have made the following clubs available:
 - Running
 - Skipping
 - Netball
 - Dodgeball
 - Volleyball
 - Tennis
 - Golf
 - Fencing
 - Football
 - Keep fit
 - Dance
- Based on our pupil voice survey (September 2017) other clubs to be arranged will include: rounders, orienteering and additional fencing sessions

Intended outcomes at Barmby Moor

- Enhance the skills and confidence of staff through hands on staff development
- Increase opportunities for extra-curricular sport, to allow pupils to opportunity to engage in 30 minutes of physical activity per day
- Promote and improve the fitness of KS2 children through provision of a wide range of sporting activities

- Improve the quality of teaching so that all children reach the performance levels they are capable of
- Enhance participation in, and enjoyment of, PE and Sports within and outside school
- Promote healthy lifestyles amongst children and encourage higher levels of physical activity
- Engage, encourage, support and develop those children identified with specific skills and talents in areas of Physical Education
- Provide pupils with a voice so that they can choose what activities they can take part in
- Encourage KS2 children to develop their leadership skills through organising lunch time activities such as: skipping, tag games and netball

We intend to spend this on:

- Hiring sports coaches and staff to deliver extra-curricular clubs each day in the week to allow pupils to have the option of achieving 30 minutes of physical activity per day
- Purchasing new play equipment to enhance the amount of activities available to pupils at playtime
- Purchasing new PE equipment to allow staff to teach high quality lessons with excellent resources

- Fund travel to a Brownlee Foundation Triathlon for Y5/6 on 24th of May to allow pupils the chance to experience a new sport
- Golf Coach (£497) and tennis coach (£210) to come in and deliver extra-curricular clubs throughout the summer term to increase physical activity provision across the week to 30 minutes per day
