Here is an outline of the Maths and English tasks we would like you to be working on each day using the Home Learning section on www.barmbymoorschool.com. We have also set an additional task for each day linked with another subject area.

Remember – try your best!

Monday:

Maths – Practise your number bonds to 8 and 9.

English – Read the poem Dad and the Cat and the Tree, sequence the pictures and predict what could happen next.

R.E. – Spend some time outside looking at nature. Which things are human made and which things are physical? How do you think the physical things first came to be? Christians and Jewish people believe that God made these things. Watch this clip <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/clips/z62hyrd>. If these things have a creator, what might the creator be like? (for example, amazing, huge, strong, full of ideas, happy, magic).

Tuesday:

Maths – Double your numbers to 10.

English – Find the rhyming words and label an animal with describing words and phrases.

Topic – What is a coastline? Use the map found on the Class 2 page to answer the questions about the UK and its coast.

Wednesday:

Maths – Use your doubles and number bonds to help you add three numbers.

English – Use the repeated phrases to create a story map for 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'.

Science – We are well into spring now and there are lots of beautiful flowers about. Create a tally chart

Thursday:

Maths – Make the spider jump down the 100 square to add 10's to 2-digit numbers.

English – Compare the two stories. Then use actions to try and learn 'We're Going on a Lion Hunt' off by heart.

Art – The Government have created a fantastic resource full of videos made by teachers across the Country. We really like this art lesson that uses nature to make colourful art.

Friday:

Maths – Make the spider climb up the 100 square to subtract 10's from 2-digit numbers.

English – Compare the two letters to decide what a good letter should look like. Use the letter template to write a letter back to bear.

PSHE – Make a pretend toy shop and label some toys with an amount between 1p and £1. Then make some money out of paper, or use real or pretend coins to buy some toys. Think carefully about how you'll spend your money. Do you want to spend it all on one big thing or lots of little things?
