Here is an outline of the Maths and English tasks I would like you to be working on each day using the Home Learning section on www.barmbymoore.com. I have also set an additional task for each day linked with another subject area.

Remember – just have a go and try your best!

YEAR 2

Monday:

Maths – Exploring odd and even numbers.

English – Read the story Angry Cat and explore sentences with conjunctions in.

Tuesday:

Maths – Multiplication methods, including arrays.

English – Read the Page from Rat's Diary, learn the key features and keep your own diary.

Wednesday:

Maths – Multiplication and division methods and word problems.

English – Listen to the traditional Russian folk story - Baba Yaga and the Black Geese. Answer comprehension questions.

Thursday:

Maths – Adding 5 numbers together.

English – Read the story Baba Yaga and the Black Geese and compare the two versions.

Friday:

Maths – Subtracting 2 digit numbers by counting up.

English – Explore the story of Hansel and Gretel. Add capital letters where they've been missed out.

YEAR 3

Monday:

Maths – Explore fractions and finding pairs of fractions.

English – Explore extracts from Fantastic Mr Fox, focussing on the characters.

Tuesday:

Maths – Compare and order fractions.

English – Read more of Fantastic Mr Fox and work on different verb forms.

Wednesday:

Maths – Explore pairs of fractions that add to 1 whole.

English – Write your own short story using Fantastic Mr Fox as inspiration.

Thursday:

Maths – Write and draw analogue and digital clock times.

English – Explore what prepositions are and how they are used.

Friday:

Maths – Match analogue and digital clock times; 1/4-hour increments.

English – Revise prepositions and learn how to sequence instructions.

Additional Tasks for Year 2 and 3:

Monday: RE - The Christian Value this half term is Perseverance. Find out what this means and give an example of when you have had to persevere.

Tuesday: History - Find out what the Roman name for York was. Where might we find Roman remains in York today?

Wednesday: Science - Find out what carnivores, herbivores and omnivores are and draw and label a picture example of each.
